

EAFF Safeguarding Policy – Simple Version for Kids

At EAFF, we want to make sure that all kids taking part in our amputee football camps feel safe, happy, and included. This policy helps protect you and make sure everyone is treated fairly and with respect.

Who does this apply to?

This policy is for everyone involved in the camp: EAFF staff, volunteers, coaches, and helpers.

Our Main Rules

- 1. Safety First: Keeping you safe is the most important thing for us.
- 2. Everyone is Equal: We treat all kids with kindness and respect, no matter who they are or where they come from.
- 3. **Honesty and Openness:** We will always talk openly with you and your parents about how we keep you safe.

Who Has What Responsibilities?

- **EAFF Staff and Volunteers:** They know how to keep you safe and are trained to help you.
- Coaches: They will coach you safely and make sure you're doing okay—both physically and emotionally.
- Parents/Guardians: They can stay involved and check on how you're doing during the camp.

How We Should Treat Each Other

• **Be Kind and Respectful:** Everyone—staff, volunteers, and kids—should be nice to each other. Bullying or being mean is never allowed.





- **Personal Space:** Staff will only touch you if it's necessary for your safety or for helping with football. They will always make sure you feel comfortable.
- **Supervision:** You will always be watched carefully by adults, especially if you're new to the camp or need extra help.

What Happens if There's a Problem?

- If you feel unsafe or see something wrong, tell the **Safeguarding Officer** or any adult in charge.
- The adults will listen to you and take action if needed. This could mean talking to those involved, telling your parents, or, in some cases, getting outside help.

Checking Our Rules

We look at our rules regularly to make sure they're working and are up to date. If something important changes, we update them straight away.

Keeping Information Private

Any information about you or any problems will stay private. Only the people who need to know will be told.

Getting Help

If there is a problem, we will make sure you get help right away. This could include talking to a trusted adult or counselor. We'll keep checking in with you to make sure you're okay.

Talking About Safety

We will explain all the rules and safety tips to you in a way that's easy to understand. If you ever have any questions or feel unsafe, you'll always know who to talk to.
